#### Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Updates

#### **SEND Coffee Morning**

We are holding an informal coffee morning on **Monday 7<sup>th</sup> March at 10am** for parents and carers of children with SEND. Invites will be sent out after half term. Claire Stirland (Occupational Therapist) from Sensory Worx will be there alongside Miss Gregg (SENCO). The coffee morning will be a chance for parents, carers, staff and professionals to meet and have informal discussions. It will be useful to have discussions and gather views on SEND support at West Cornforth Primary School, as well as find out what information you would like to be covered in future coffee mornings. If the morning is a success, we will be organising further events with different professionals to further support parents and carers, so please come along if you're free!



#### **SEND Meetings for Parents and Carers**

SEND review meetings will be in place of progress meetings for parents/carers of children with SEND. These meetings will take place on **Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March**, with appointments available **from 1:15pm.** You will be contacted by the school to arrange an appointment. This meeting will be with the class teacher and the school SENCO (Miss Gregg). Your child's SEND support will be reviewed and you will also be given a general progress update regarding their attainment and achievement in school. If you have a preferred time, please contact the class teacher via Class Dojo.

#### What is ELSA?

There will always be children and young people in schools facing life challenges that detract from their ability to engage with learning. Some will require greater support to increase their emotional literacy than others. ELSA is an initiative developed and supported by educational psychologists. It recognises that children learn better and are happier in school if their emotional needs are also addressed. We are very lucky to have two members of staff who are almost finished their Emotional Literacy Support Assistant training. They have been trained by educational psychologists to plan and deliver programmes of support to pupils who are experiencing temporary or longer term additional emotional needs. The majority of ELSA work is delivered on an individual basis, but sometimes small group work is more appropriate, especially in the areas of social and friendship skills.


